We recognize that a history of oppression, marginalization, and disinvestment has resulted in ongoing disparities within our community. As a community-centered nonprofit, we work to counteract these disparities in every facet of our programs and operations.

COMMON CHORD PROGRAMS & OPPORTUNITIES

Common Chord is a non-profit organization creating music experiences, helping to connect Quad Citizens and building a stronger community where all can thrive. Common Chord is committed to providing inclusive, results-oriented music education programming and community initiatives that have an impact on the individual and for the larger community. Brief descriptions and the opportunities for the current Common Chord Education Programming and Community Initiatives include:

INTUNE MUSIC MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Classroom Mentor

InTune is a music mentorship program providing student-led music experiences in partnership with community centers and after-school programs throughout the Quad Cities.

Each week our artist mentors utilize music to encourage students to get *in tune* with their identities, build confidence, and envision a positive path forward in life. The program provides relevant education and long-term mentoring relationships.

InTune is currently provided at Project Renewal (Davenport), the Martin Luther King Center (Rock Island), Boys & Girls Clubs (Moline & Davenport), and Spring Forward (Moline).

JERRY BROWN ACOUSTIC MUSIC CLUBS

The Jerry Brown Acoustic Music Clubs provide inclusive music enrichment programs for youth and adults of **all** abilities. With a variety of partners, these programs allow participants to express themselves in new ways, help build social skills, and **have fun** in a lively, interactive environment!

This program is named in memory of Jerry Brown, a local musician who had a passion for accessible and inclusive music enrichment. We carry on his spirit of joy and music through the Acoustic Music Clubs.

Acoustic Music Clubs currently take place at The Arc of the Quad Cities, Blackhawk Special Education Center, Empowering Abilities (formerly Handicapped Development Center), and Empower House.

Common Chord offers two special events each year – QC Flavor Fest and Battle of the Bosses – to raise financial support and awareness for our mission. We also periodically host Trivia Night and other "game night type" fundraisers.

In October, Join us for QC Flavor Fest as we sample the best food and drink made right here in the Quad Cities! Taste the best the Quad Cities has to offer and vote on your "favorite," all while raising funds to support music education programming for kids.

Battle of the Bosses, which takes place in the spring each year, showcases hidden talents and community support in a spirited competition featuring ten acts of various industry and community leaders competing live on stage in the Redstone Room for the audience's vote. The ticketed event also is a fundraiser and 100% of funds raised will directly fund Common Chord's education programs, creating accessible and inclusive music experiences for youth.

VOLUNTEER GUIDELINES

PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

As a mission-driven, community-centric nonprofit entity that provides opportunities to people of all ages and backgrounds, Common Chord takes our stewardship obligations very seriously. Volunteers should ensure that their behavior and public statements (whether made on behalf of the organization or not) reflect Common Chord's mission and values. Volunteers shall not commit any act or do anything at any time which might be reasonably considered to injure, tarnish, or otherwise negatively affect the reputation of Common Chord, including but not limited to actions or statements outside the scope of the agreement, consumption of illegal substances on Common Chord property, mistreatment of Common Chord property or equipment, or any actions or public statements contrary to Common Chord's nonprofit mission and values.

At all times, you are required to conduct yourself in a manner that is professional and appropriate to the setting. You are required to exhibit behavior that is positive and in the best interest of Common Chord.

As a volunteer of a community-based nonprofit, you should be aware that you are seen as a representative of the organization, even when you are not at work. Therefore, we encourage you to conduct yourself in alignment with the values of our organization at all times.

VOLUNTEER BENEFITS

We appreciate the commitment of time and talent made by our volunteers. All time generously provided by volunteers to our organization will be logged for individual recognition and organizational reporting purposes. Current/active Common Chord volunteers are eligible to receive various branded clothing items, free admission to selected Common Chord events, and vouchers for free soda or draft beer (limit one per event) at the Redstone Room and Skybridge Courtyard bars (for the event at which they are volunteering).

SCHEDULING & ATTENDANCE

Volunteer schedules are typically created by the Volunteer Manager once the required paperwork has been completed. Volunteers should maintain open communication regarding the schedule. If unavailable to work as scheduled, it is strongly appreciated to immediately contact the office.

We understand this is a volunteer commitment and appreciate the generosity of your time and talents. We also appreciate volunteers showing up when committed and being present and ready to work at your scheduled time. Excessive unplanned absences are disruptive, place an unfair burden on others, and are challenging for the organization.

OFFICE CLOSURE / EVENT CANCELLATION

Communication will be provided in the event of an unscheduled office closure or unanticipated event cancellation for which a volunteer was scheduled to work.

ABUSE AND BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES

ORGANIZATION POLICY

Child abuse and neglect are unlawful acts. It is against the organization's policy for any volunteer or employee, male or female, to physically, sexually, or mentally abuse or neglect any child. In accordance with this policy, Common Chord will neither condone nor tolerate:

- Infliction of physically abusive behavior or bodily injury upon children;
- Physical neglect of children, including failure to provide adequate safety measures, care, and supervision in relation to organization's activities;
- Emotional maltreatment of children, including verbal abuse and/or verbal attacks.

Common Chord reserves the right to dismiss or to exclude from affiliation any volunteer or employee implementing programs that is found guilty of child abuse or neglect or has been convicted of child abuse or neglect. The organization will consider any of the above-mentioned prohibitions as the basis for progressive disciplinary action that can include dismissal or termination. The organization believes that in order to protect the health, safety, and general well-being of participants, no person named on any state's Sex Offender Registry will be permitted to act as an employee or volunteer in any capacity for the organization.

GUIDELINES FOR STAFF/VOLUNTEER BEHAVIOR

The following rules are prevention techniques.

1. Staff/Volunteers shall avoid being alone with a client, patron, volunteer, or student under 18 years of age. To prevent this occurrence, always have two adults present. When not possible, have one staff present with several students.

2. Programs, educational activities, and student engagement should always occur in well lit and easily accessible areas. Intimate and secluded settings are to be avoided.

3. Generally avoid touching students, especially by initiating contact. Patting clients on the seat as a symbol of congratulations or encouragement, as often found in athletics, is forbidden. If a client hugs you, divert the contact so it becomes shoulder-to-shoulder rather than pelvis-to-pelvis.

4. Staff/Volunteers shall not transport students in a private vehicle or to any location other than the program site.

5. No after hours or "special" relationships during or following the student's involvement with the organization are allowed.

6. Volunteers shall not work with children without a staff member present.

Any volunteer working with children will be required to pass a background check.

VOLUNTEER HANDBOOK ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

I have received a digital or printed copy of the Common Chord Volunteer Handbook. I understand that it is my responsibility to read, understand, and comply with all the policies, procedures, and guidelines contained in the Volunteer Handbook. These general volunteer guidelines and procedures apply to all Common Chord volunteers.

- Please notify supervisor if unable to volunteer on scheduled day/time.
- Volunteers should follow the instructions of their supervisor.
- Please dress appropriately for the volunteer task. If unsure, ask.
- Volunteers must follow a code of confidentiality pertaining to any information available to them as such information is private and should not be discussed outside of volunteering.
- No one under the influence or in possession of drugs and/or alcohol will be permitted to volunteer.
- Pease refrain from smoking while volunteering. Depending on where a volunteer is placed, there may be smoking breaks.
- No firearms and/or weapons of any kind are permitted at any volunteer space.
- Sexual harassment will not be tolerated. Sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, unwelcome and/or unsolicited sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature. Any volunteer who believes he/she has been harassed should notify his/her supervisor immediately.
- Violence, harassing behavior, or offensive speech will not be tolerated.
- Please report all accidents and/or injuries to your supervisor and/or staff immediately.

I agree to indemnify and hold Common Chord harmless against any and all claims, liabilities, damages and expense (including the expense of litigation and reasonable attorney fees) in whole or in part by reason of my negligence, gross negligence or willful misconduct, including but not limited to, personal injury or property damage incurred by any third parties as a result thereof.

I understand and accept these guidelines put forth by Common Chord. I will use my best judgment in adhering to these guidelines, and will ask Common Chord staff if any questions or uncertainties arise pertaining to these guidelines.
